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What is a MOOC?



Massive- A lot of students. These online classes enrolled over 1,00,000

Open- Taking the classes are free. However, if you want a certificate of completion, some programs require fees.

Online- No attendance necessary... Its all online. It's combination of streaming video, forums and written and interactive online material.

Course- Emphasize key features of a class such as engagement with the material, ideation and networking with other students.

MOOC



A Massive Open Online Course is an online course aimed at large-scale interactive participation and open access via the web.

In addition to traditional course materials such as videos, readings and problem sets, MOOCs provide interactive user forums that help build a community for the students, professors, and teaching assistants.

MOOCs are recent development in distance education.

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Is an online course with the option of free and open registration, a publicly-shared curriculum and open ended outcomes.

MOOCs integrate social networking, accessible online resources, and are facilitated by leading practitioners in the field of study.

Most significantly, MOOCs build on the engagement of learners who self-organize their participation according to learning goals, prior knowledge and skills, and common interests.

Massive



It should allow access to a very large number of students, much larger than a face-to-face class, or a traditional online course.

The course should be prepared to accept changes in the number of students in several orders of magnitude, for example, going from 1,000 to 1,00,000 students, without a major problem for operation.

Open



Open has several meanings in MOOCs.

1. The course should be open to everyone and should not require some prerequisites such as possession of a qualification or a level of performance in earlier studies.
2. The access to educational resources (videos, lecture notes) should be free.
3. Open is also often interpreted as it does not make use of a closed learning platform, but educational resources are hosted in different places like websites, blogs, wikis, or multimedia repositories.

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4. Open is also often interpreted as the course makes extensive use of open content, and in turn, content generated by the course is also published open so it can be reused by others.

Online



The course is done remotely via the INTERNET and does not require physical attendance at a classroom.

This feature is essential for anyone from anywhere in the world with an internet connection can participate in these courses.
