

#### Best Practice -1

Title: Yoga programme for physical and spiritual development of Teacher Trainees.

#### The Context:

B.Ed. Programme is of one year duration. Throughout the academic year teacher trainees need to complete curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities. The schedule of all activities is very hectic. Teacher trainees have to complete various activities speedily within stipulated time. Automatically stress related problems occur in their life. Sometimes they can not even participate in co-curricular and extra curricular activities due to loss of energy. Therefore, Yoga has become need of the time which helps them to cope of with this hectic schedule. Yoga is important for health. Yoga is the best option to manage stress related problems and helps them for stress management. After participating yoga programme teacher trainees can take part in other activities. Their personality is developed and they become agile and androit in their work.

#### Objectives:

- > To introduce the concept of yoga in general.
- > To introduce philosophical background of 'Ashtang Yog'.
- To inculcate the values essential for personality development of teacher trainees through Yoga.
- > To make the teacher trainees aware of the theoretical and practical aspects of various yogic processes.
- > To help them to perform asanas and other yogic processes.

#### The Practice:

#### Step - I: Introduction of Yoga:

For this purpose yoga teacher gives a lecture on 'Ashtang Yog', 'Yog Asanas', Meditation, Pranayam. The experts explain basic need and importance of yoga, theory and practical of each asana as per the time schedule.

#### Step - II: Presentation and Practice:

The expert / yoga teacher gives basic information about yoga. It is then followed by demonstration of yogic processes and asanas. Teacher trainees perform the asanas as per directions.

The different yogic processes are as follows:

- Yogasana: Padmasan, Siddhasan, Sukhasan, Makarasan, Shalbhasan, Uttanpadasan, Bhujangasan, Naukasan, Shavasan, Sarvangasan, Halasan, Tadasan, Vrukshasan, Trikonsan, Garuddasan, Marajarasan etc.
- Meditation and its steps:

#### **Duration and Time table**

Yoga activity is arranged for 3 months. Everyday before college time this activity is organized from 10 to 11 am. Duration is from December to February.

#### Obstacles:

- Even if teacher trainees are in the age group of 22 to 30 years, they are not able to practice yoga properly.
- Though the yoga practice is pre-scheduled, the teacher trainees are not able to attend it regularly, due to heavy workload and other course related activities.

#### Impact of the practice:

- 1. Teacher trainees could manage physical problems.
- 2. Their enthusiasm is increased.
- 3. These activities were helpful for stress management.
- 4. Their knowledge about concept of 'yoga' and its background was enhanced.
- 5. Some teacher trainees were motivated to join yoga courses.
- 6. They became agile and adroit.

#### **Best Practice -2**

Title: Staff Academy for the Faculty Members:

#### >> The Context:

In the present global scenario, brainstorming on new trends has become very important aspect of teacher education. The changing modern world has its impact necessarily on teaching learning strategies, modes of transaction and evaluation procedure. To arrange such staff academy was necessary for the teacher educators so as to make them think reflectively on these modern trends trends for their professional and personality development. #### >> Objectives:
